## ARE YOU A QUALIFIED HOMEOWNER?

TO QUALIFY FOR AN AMP GRANT, YOU MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS.

#### INCOME REQUIREMENTS:

 Your gross household income must be at or below 80% Area Median Income (AMI). To check your AMI please see table below.

#### HOMEOWNER REQUIREMENTS

- All household members are age 62 or older; or
- All household members are age 62 or older and age 17 or younger where the household member age 62 or older is the guardian of the younger household members; or
- $\circ \;\;$  A household member of any age has a permanent disability
- o You must obtain a bid from two (2) independent contractors
- O You must provide all requested income and other documentation

#### PROPERTY REQUIREMENTS:

- All persons listed on the deed must live in the home (except for a child for estate planning purposes)
- You must have lived in the home for at least six
   (6) months prior to applying for AMP
- Your mortgage and property taxes must be paid as agreed and current
- Your home is a single-family home, condominium, duplex, or manufactured home with certain restrictions

WITH THE ACCESSIBILITY MODIFICATION PROGRAM (AMP)

#### 2021 GRANT INFORMATION

Homeowners that meet this program's requirements can receive up to \$10,000 in funding through the Accessibility Modification Program (AMP) to make eligible repairs and modifications to their homes to make it more accessible.



#### WHAT REPAIRS ARE ELIGIBLE?

This is a complete list of eligible repairs. If the repair you need is not on this list, it does not qualify for the program.

- Ramps/zero entry steps
- Handrails
- Levered door handles
- Self-closing hinges (internal/external doors)
- Pocket doors or swing hinges
- Internal chair and wheelchair lifts
- Plumbing and electrical modifications necessary to relocate laundry facilities to main level of the home
- Kitchen modifications
- Lowering existing cabinets
- Widened doorways
- Installation of smoke detectors or carbon monoxide detectors
- Universal design flooring



#### Here are things you need to know about the COVID-19 vaccine:

- You will **not** need to pay anything out-of-pocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- You cannot pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine.
- You **cannot** pay to get early access to the vaccine.
- You will not be solicited door to door to receive the vaccine.
- No one from Medicare will contact you.

**No one** from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer, like a private insurance company, will call you asking for your Medicare number, Social Security number, or your credit card or bank account information to sign you up to get the vaccine.
